INTRODUCTION TO SERVICE

The service this afternoon is known as the “Seven Last Words of Christ.” The tradition began in Peru in the 17th century by a Jesuit priest. According to tradition, he developed a service of meditation for Good Friday based on the last words of Jesus. Soon, the tradition spread around the world and the last words of Jesus, recorded in the gospels, became part of the Church’s Lenten practice. The service includes elements of readings, responses, silent reflections and prayer, designed to help us contemplate more deeply on the passion and death of Jesus.
