**The Mission of the Month for May is Ukraine**

The month of May will highlight Ukraine in music and mission. Please make your monthly mission donations in support of the people of Ukraine. Donations can be made by check. Please indicate Ukraine in the memo line. You may also give online. Our donations will be sent to the Lutheran Diocese of Warsaw, Poland, an organization recommended to Rev. White. They have a history of supporting refugee services. With the flow of Ukrainian refugees into Poland the Polish Government has turned to this organization to aid in relocating families either in homes or refugee sites. This appears to be the most direct way to get funds to those on the frontlines of resettlement in Poland.

**Thank you to our guest musician, Dan Flonta**

A native of Romania, Dan now lives on Cape Cod with his family, and is a very active member of the performing arts community on Cape Cod. He is the founder and first violinist of the Cape Cod String Quartet, regularly performs with Falmouth Chamber Players and the Plymouth Philharmonic. He has a private violin studio as well as being on the Faculty of Sturgis Charter School. Dan earned his Master of Music in Violin Performance from Bowling Green State University in Ohio and his Bachelor of Music in Violin Performance from The Gheorghe Dima Music Academy in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. He has performed extensively throughout Europe and North America. Dan performs solo and chamber music concerts throughout the year on his instrument of choice made by luthier Ray Melanson, who won a Gold Medal for tone at the 2012 Art of Sound International Competition. The violin is based on a Giuseppe Guarneri del Jesu violin made in 1742.
