Leader: We greet one another on this joyous eve in celebration of the arrival of our Lord and King. For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given. Let us rejoice!

ALL: We have heard the Good News! We have come to see this miracle that has happened. Let us praise God. Let our hearts be filled with good cheer for all. Tonight we all gather at the manger to witness the true miracle of Christmas.

We light the first candle to remind us of hope. (Light 1st candle)

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; the light to rule His kingdom, to order it and establish it with judgment and justice from that time forward, even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.

This night these words are fulfilled in our hearing and in our living for the promise of God has come to us. Our lives are the manger in whom the Christ child is born. No longer do we seek light from another source; now the light burns in our hearts and we become the vessels of God's love." So we light the candle at the center of our wreath and our faith.
